The court sua sponte removes this case from the regular calendar and places it on the court’s accelerated calendar, 1st Dist. Loc.R. 11.1(C)(1), and this judgment entry is not an opinion of the court. *See* Rep.Op.R. 3.1; App.R. 11.1(E).

Defendant-appellant Juandais Sims pled guilty to aggravated robbery and felonious assault, along with an accompanying weapon specification and was sentenced to an aggregate indeterminate sentence of four years to five-and-a-half years of imprisonment. In a single assignment of error, Sims argues that the Reagan Tokes Law is unconstitutional because it lacks procedural due process. This court considered, and found to be without merit, an identical challenge to the Reagan Tokes Law in *State v. Guyton*, 1st Dist. Hamilton No. C-190657, 2022-Ohio-2962, ¶ 57, *appeal accepted*, 168 Ohio St.3d 1418, 2022-Ohio-3752, 196 N.E.3d 850. Following our precedent in *Guyton*, we overrule Sims’s assignment of error and affirm the trial court’s judgment.
